#### FROM THE CHURCH **Dear Friends**

As I write this, we have begun our journey through Lent. We will travel through the lengthening days into March and our celebration of caring on Mothering Sunday (6<sup>th</sup> March) then turning our attention to Jesus' journey into Jerusalem, to his Last Supper, death, and finally to his resurrection, on Easter morning. The 'journey of life' is a familiar theme and reminds us that change, moving on, is inevitable for human beings, just as it is for everything that is alive.

Lent (from an old English word meaning 'spring') and Easter, though, remind us that our journey can be not just 'of' life but into life. All around us we see evidence of new life and growth, particularly in the natural world at this time of year. One of the blessings of living in a country where we have relatively clearly marked seasons of winter, spring, summer and autumn, is that we are more aware of the cycle of death and life; that new life does come after a period of cold and apparent barrenness.

Through Lent we move from cold and darkness to warmth, colour and light. Mothering Sunday provides an opportunity to say 'thank you' to those who nurture and care for us and reminds us of our dependence on other people to help us flourish and grow, not only during our childhood but at every stage of our lives. Easter is our great celebration of life which we traditionally mark with eggs, lambs, chicks and bunnies - all symbols of new life. In the Christian church Easter has traditionally been a time for baptism (christening) and this year it is our joy to have a baptism at Ramsholt church on Easter Day and celebJesus said 'I have come that you may have life in all its abundance' and by rising from the dead he demonstrates that death is not the end; that life and love are stronger than death and evil. A real cause for celebration.

# SHOTTISHAM PARISH COUNCIL

SCDC have now responded to the Parish Council's request for clarification on preferred location for any new housing and will be designating the Sorrel Horse field as the preferred site. This has the advantage of providing housing in the centre of the village, to meet the needs identified in the survey, and also providing additional parking for the Sorrel Horse. The trustees of the Adeane Estate continue to express an interest in building on the land east of Heath Drive, but I indicated that it was unlikely this would be supported by the parish.

The Parish Council is keen to co-opt two new Councillors. We did receive an application from outside the parish, but could not accept it since the applicant had not been resident for the required period. Be aware that if we do not receive applications from the village we may be required to accept future applications from outside.

To date we only have one respondent willing to support the Speedwatch initiative. I will continue to pursue the activity, but it would be helpful if others were willing to support us.

You may be aware that the WI accepted a donation from a local business in exchange for displaying a banner on their property. Sadly, somebody took it upon themselves to remove the banner. This is clearly unacceptable behaviour, so I would ask that the person responsible please return the banner to its rightful owner.
