Gardening gems from Ivan

It has been said that we do not have a climate, just weather. We went away for a few days and locally you enjoyed high temperatures and no rain. We return and we have had two inches of rain in three days. Now the sun is shining we must go and check on the state of the allotment and dig some potatoes.

Two weeks of rapid growth – the runner beans are at the top of their canes, in full flower, and enough beans for a feed (July 12th). French beans need picking, courgettes are now marrows, and disease is terminating the growth of the onions, but hopefully enough left in them to make reasonable sized bulbs. Main crop potatoes look promising, and of course the obligatory weeds are doing really well. So we need a concerted effort for a few hours to get things back on an even keel. We have some empty land so I'm tempted to put down some green manure seeds, to be due in at a later date. The strawberries need a good clean up and reestablishing elsewhere on clean land. The heavy rainfall has saved our new plantings in the garden, most of them are doing well, but one or two are struggling and will need some TLC.

Whilst away we only visited one garden, Threave near Castle Douglas in Dumfries. Due to their annual rainfall everything is large and green, well worth a visit, but one really needs to visit a garden several times a year to enjoy the seasonal changes and the variation in plant displays.

Proceeds from the Shottisham Photographic Book.

We now have nearly £300. in hand from the sale of the book and still selling, both in the parish and at Browsers Bookshop. I think the time has come to make up our minds on how we use these proceeds.

Some of the earlier suggestions from me and others have proved unsustainable. The telephone box is still owned by BT and operable. The planting of trees and hedges brings into question the ownership of the land. However, Helen Kemp and Bruce Chapple have come up with a series of ideas and I would like to have your views. I have spoken to the Parish Council and have an idea of their preference

- 1. Creating and improving butterfly habits in the village, beginning with a survey and/or workshops .
- 2. Talks/workshops/village trails and surveys on native and sustainable wildlife friendly trees and hedgerow plants.
- 3. Improving existing habitat and nesting sites for swifts, including providing swift boxes.

All these ideas would involve obtaining expert advice from organisations such as RSPB, Butterfly Conservation and Suffolk Wildlife, but I do not anticipate there would be any problem with this.

We would also need a few interested people in the village to take part.

I already have an ecologist who has said he would be happy to come and make swift boxes (perhaps in the Trust Hall with the help of others). We could then pay for the hire of the hall and the materials from our proceeds.

I have also agreed with Christine Block, our District Councillor, that some of the proceeds will go towards having the photograph of the Trust Hall from the book enlarged and framed ready for the refurbishment of the Hall.

Could I now ask for your views on these ideas? Please email or phone me – it would be great to get going in the autumn if we can get enough enthusiastic people together.
