Gardening gems from Ivan Growth and development are mainly governed by moisture and temperature, and they have both been lacking in recent weeks which has resulted in slow growth. However, with irrigation and the protection of a crop cover (fleece) the balance can be restored, as witnessed with our strawberries, courgettes, beetroot and lettuce. Potatoes and onions are now making good progress, runner and French beans have been sown and I have a few to transplant this weekend. In the greenhouse-tomato and cucumber plants are ready for planting. We have some summer bedding plants – geranium, mimulus and gazania almost ready for planting out, but it's two weeks too soon, in case of late frosts. We have bought a collection of regal pelargoniums which will soon need potting on into litre pots to make decent seed flowering plants. The garden continues to develop with some partition fencing, shrubs and perennials purchased, planted and well watered in, but still room for more. The hedgehog we had in the garden has come to a sticky end at the hands of a fox or some other predator considering the remains I found. We are now in the period of maximum growth and development with both crops and weeds making rapid growth over a 24 hour period. Anyone who has fleeced their early potatoes should soon be harvesting these delicious first early tubers. When conditions permit, keep the hoe going to disturb and destroy weed seedlings.
