Now that October is here, the days are getting short and the nights are drawing in. Darkness seems to be closing in – and not just literally but in events we hear of around the world and perhaps in our own life too. Autumn is traditionally a time of melancholy as we reflect on the fading of summer light and warmth. Some people try to neutralise the scariness of dark thoughts and fears – things of the night' by confronting them at Halloween.

Much of Christianity emphasises the coming of the light of Jesus Christ into a world of darkness. We celebrate that Light particularly at Christmas and Easter but also at the feast of All Saints (1<sup>st</sup> November, the day after the 'eve of All Hallows' or Halloween). Yet darkness – physical or spiritual – is a fact of life and God is with us in our darkness just as much as in the light. Although it is harder for us humans to see in the dark, it can be a time of growth and re-creation as well as a time of rest. I can remember a summer visit to Iceland when the almost continuous daylight made it difficult to sleep, to 'switch off'. A time of darkness, pain, grief or anxiety can be very difficult and is not something we actively seek or welcome. But through darkness and doubt often come the greatest creativity and faith. ## Confirmation – what is it? What's involved?

'Confirmation' comes from a Latin word meaning to strengthen. In the Church of England, a service of Confirmation, led by a Bishop, is the opportunity for people to make a public commitment to the Christian faith, *confirming* for themselves the promises that were made on their behalf if they were baptised/christened as infants. (Those who are not already baptised can be baptised at the same service.) The Bishop prays for God's Holy Spirit to *strengthen* each person to continue to grow in their relationship with God. There is going to be a service of Confirmation locally on Wed November 8<sup>th</sup> and there is an opportunity for both youngsters (at least 10 years old) and adults to explore Christian faith and whether they would like to be confirmed, starting this month. ## Gardening gems from Ivan

Interesting time of the year — growth continues apace but time and inclination are not always conducive to getting things done, ie controlling weeds, clearing spent crops and generally keeping the allotment neat and tidy. I must confess I am as guilty as the next person when it comes to getting things done at the right time, rather than playing catch-up. I will hide behind the shield of the weather and other commitments, responsibilities and general laziness. Now is the time to consider the season and then for next year, less of this, more of that - try something new/different. Seed catalogues are starting the rounds, and tree and plant sales are cropping up everywhere. The hanging baskets have been taken down and returned to the nursery from whence they came. We bought some violas yesterday and management is threatening to make up some hanging baskets. I intend treating the grass one more time this season with weed and feed whilst growth is still strong. The regal pergonium cuttings I took a few weeks ago have rooted well and will soon need potting up. The tomatoes in the greenhouse have succumbed to leaf disease, possibly blight, so will need clearing out soon. I am allowed another week of taking it easy, then I must start tidying up and eventually start some digging. End of the allotment season means it's time for me to send out the bills, so I won't be very popular.
