#### Gardening gems from Ivan

The general growth rate remains high and it is difficult to keep on top of weeds, grass and crops. However, we should not complain as runner beans and raspberries etc continue to crop heavily. All crops seem to be doing well as are caterpillars, but not too many aphids this season. We've cleared our onions and potatoes and sown some green manure. We're trying to keep the allotment as tidy as possible as it can very quickly become overgrown with weeds, and remember one year's seeding means seven years' weeding.

In the garden we must keep the hanging baskets watered, also plants for the greenhouse. Tomatoes have started ripening at last, and the grass continues to improve following the application of feed/weed, and I will give it another application when conditions permit. The garden is maturing quite well considering it has only been a few months since we took over. Try to keep on top of the weeds as this will pay dividends in the long run. Every day at 6.00 pm during the school holidays (and on Saturdays during the rest of the season) you are welcome to join us for *egg collection* – an extravaganza of alpaca feeding, piglet tickling, and goat cuddling and of course egg collecting.
