Gardening gems from Ivan

Spring may be just around the corner, and when we do have a warm, sunny day then things begin to move and the world is a lovely place. Then the weather man tells us we are in for another cold blast, with the wind in the east, and let's face it, the wind could stay there for weeks. However, there are signs of spring in the garden. We have in flower cyclamen, dwarf iris (reticulate and danfordia), crocus, snowdrops, hellebores and dwarf daffodils. In the greenhouse, sowings of sweet peas, lettuce, cabbage and summer heading purple sprouting broccoli are all well under way, having been germinated indoors on top of the boiler. The seed potatoes are also trayed up in the greenhouse to encourage good, strong sprouts. Watering plants in the greenhouse should be carried out early in the day to allow any excess moisture to dry off, so, choose a warm, sunny day with some wind. Patience is a virtue, keep it if you can, always in a woman, never in a man, or so the saying goes. Both in the garden and on the allotment waiting for the right conditions under foot and overhead will pay dividends in the long run. So, don't force a seedbed if the soil is too wet, this will only destroy any soil structure and delay plant establishment and growth. In the garden I have delayed cutting plants back too much because we are due another cold snap. So, be patient but be ready to respond when conditions are favourable. *Ivan Clark*
