The historic town is well worth a visit with Christ Church the most Easterly church in the country, originally for the beachmen and fishermen. The annual Scores Race of 4.75 miles up and down 401 steps finishes at this church – the Scores (steep narrow lanes) connected the 17th century fishermen's cottages to The High Street.
