Dear friends,

'Love is come again'

'Now the green blade riseth from the buried grain,
Wheat that in dark earth many days has lain;
Love lives again, that with the dead has been:
Love is come again,

Like wheat that springeth green.'

That hymn uses imagery of wheat growing from seed as a metaphor for the resurrection, just as Jesus did when he said: 'Truly, truly I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.'

St Paul uses similar imagery in his letter to the church at Corinth, both of Jesus' resurrection and our resurrection hope. I firmly believe that Jesus rose again, and that there is good evidence both in the New Testament and in the lives of people who have lived and died for him, from then until now. The New Testament does not describe the resurrection, only how it was revealed to Jesus' first followers. In Mark's gospel we hear only that the tomb was empty! How could such a unique event be described? Our Christian hope of eternal life, beginning now and continuing through death, is equally hard to describe: we can only use poetic, pictorial language, and the symbolism of new life in eggs, in lambs, of new shoots and green leaves comes naturally to us in this part of the world where our celebration of Easter coincides with Spring.

The same imagery is used in the Germinate programme our team of 17 churches are engaged in, which aims to 'support rural multi parish benefices in developing and implementing a shared vision for mission and growth.' – something we can only do by allowing the seed of the resurrection to be planted in us and our churches and allowing it to germinate, so that we may find that 'Love is come again, like wheat that springeth green.' Gardening gems from Ivan

A few days, or even a week or two's delay in planting or sowing is not the end of the world at this time of the year as establishment and growth rate will be much better as soil and air temperatures rise. Most plants were looking pretty good through the winter but the recent cold winds and frosts have taken their toll on the plants such as helianthus major, but the roots and stem bases will be fine and new growth is already showing. Rabbits or muntjac deer can do much damage to young growth of perennials and anything else that takes their fancy. It's a good time to visit gardens and nurseries for displays of early spring bulbs. There will also be some early flowering shrubs to enjoy. The rhubarb has survived under its blanket of straw, and with increasing temperatures we should be able to pull some in a week or so. I'm currently waiting for some active growth in the weeds before applying some weedkiller. To avoid repeating myself I will stop now and hope that conditions improve, as they surely will, and allow us to get things under way on the allotment. I van Clark
