Some of you may have watched the recent TV series following several 'celebrities' as they tackled the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. In recent years this route has seen greatly increased numbers of pilgrims and has inspired the Hollywood movie, *The Way*. Pilgrimage can be a way to re-centre ourselves on that which is truly important in our lives.

As you read this I hope I will be undertaking a pilgrimage of my own – walking the St Cuthbert's Way from Melrose in Scotland to Holy Island (Lindisfarne) and then down the Northumberland coast along part of the St Oswald's Way – a total of 130 miles.

Gardening gems from Ivan

The combination of sun, wind and lengthening days makes for rapid soil moisture loss. To obtain maximum benefit from watering plants ensure that you apply sufficient to soak the soil profile right through. At this time of the year weekly irrigation is about right to maintain growth and ultimate crop quality. Keep the hoe going particularly when conditions will give a quick weed kill ie sun and wind. The difference to growth that warn nights makes is obvious. Runner beans turn green, rather than the slow growth and yellowing leaves and all crops respond to higher night temperatures. We are receiving some irrigation from the potato field, mainly spray drift, but all donations gratefully received – thank you Mr Paul. Don't forget, good dust mulch will help to retain soil moisture. Strawberries are swelling nicely so will get covered soon to keep the birds off. The asparagus continues to produce good spears and the sweetcorn in the greenhouse is growing nicely. There is a 'new build' known as Grumpy's Grotto – the grand opening ceremony date and time tba. Expose the courgettes from their fleece - time spent now will pay massive dividends in the weeks ahead.
