

Christmas "Carols and Lessons by Candlelight" are always popular, especially as we all like to join in heartily with the well-known seasonal songs.

One of our favourite Christmas carols, "O, Come, All Ye Faithful," (and my personal favourite) goes back hundreds of years, perhaps to a Cistercian monastery. Often known by its Latin title, Adeste Fideles ("Come, faithful people"), this hymn is a call for God's faithful, joyous people to contemplate the "King of Angels" in Bethlehem's manger. The first verse puts out the invitation.

"O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant! O Come ye, Oh come ye to Bethlehem,

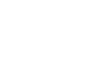
Come and behold him, born the King of Angels

God willing, we will be able to meet in church over Christmas so that we might come together and adore him, this tiny baby who changed and changes the hearts of so many people down the ages.



READY, STEADY, CENSUS

The decennial census is almost upon us.

Households across Shottisham will soon be asked to take part in the nationwide survey of housing and the population. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

Information from the digital-first census will help decide how services are planned and funded in your local area. This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, housing or new bus routes.

Households will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete their questionnaire online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request. Census day is March 21.
