Before the discussion started the clerk LR explained to the meeting the difference between holding a poll and a referendum. The clerk explained that the main difference is that a referendum is informal and non-statutory and can be carried out by anyone. A poll is statutory, highly formalised and is conducted under the auspices of the District Council with the cost being borne by the Parish Council. The results from either a poll or referendum are not legally binding. After much discussion and some debate from the floor a proposal was put forward by Chairman RK that the request for a referendum was accepted by the council. Parishioners requested that the question to be asked was taken from the petition that was handed in at September's meeting and this was agreed by the council.
